

- Forest products manufacturers are important to Ohio's economy, supported by timberland with a growth-to-removals ratio of 2:1 statewide.<sup>1</sup> **In 2007:**
  - The value of Ohio's production of *Furniture and Related Products*<sup>2</sup> was \$1.6 billion, ranking 6<sup>th</sup> nationally.<sup>3</sup>
  - The value of Ohio's production of *Wood Products*<sup>4</sup> was \$984 million, ranking 13<sup>th</sup> nationally.<sup>3</sup>
  - Ohio ranked 14<sup>th</sup> nationally in hardwood lumber production, producing 343 million board feet, or 3.3% of the nation's total production.<sup>5</sup>
- Employment in logging and primary forest products manufacturing is significant in Ohio.<sup>6</sup> **In 2008:**
  - 343 people were employed in logging in Ohio, ranking 24<sup>th</sup> nationally.
  - 1,490 people were employed in sawmills in Ohio, ranking 25<sup>th</sup> nationally.
  - 4,423 people were employed in paper and paperboard mills in Ohio, ranking 13<sup>th</sup> nationally.
- Ohio is an employment leader in several secondary forest industry sectors.<sup>6</sup> **In 2008:**
  - 4,466 people were employed in wood container and pallet manufacturing in Ohio, ranking 2<sup>nd</sup> nationally.
  - 7,597 people were employed in wood kitchen cabinet and countertop manufacturing in Ohio, ranking 5<sup>th</sup> nationally.
  - 18,689 people were employed in converted paper product manufacturing in Ohio, ranking 5<sup>th</sup> nationally.
  - 3,576 people were employed in nonupholstered wood household furniture manufacturing in Ohio, ranking 6<sup>th</sup> nationally.
  - 1,025 people were employed in truss manufacturing in Ohio, ranking 9<sup>th</sup> nationally.
  - 4,400 people were employed in millwork manufacturing in Ohio, ranking 10<sup>th</sup> nationally.
