



PULPWOOD PRODUCTION^{1/} IN THE LAKE STATES BY COUNTY, 1986

ABSTRACT.--Lake States pulpwood production rose to a record 7.71 million cords in 1986. Pulpwood production is shown by county and species group in Michigan, Minnesota, and Wisconsin.

KEY WORDS: Residue, Michigan, Minnesota, Wisconsin.

Pulpwood production in the Lake States--Michigan, Minnesota, and Wisconsin--climbed from 6.84 million cords in 1985 to a record 7.71 million cords in 1986. Wisconsin produced 2.92 million cords, Michigan produced 2.81 million cords, and Minnesota produced 1.98 million cords.

Ninety-two percent of pulpwood came from roundwood (including chips from roundwood); the remainder came from mill residue such as slabs, edgings, veneer cores, and chips from these materials. Production from softwood and hardwood residue by State was:

Principal species harvested were aspen (3,656,800 cords), pine (953,500 cords), maple (783,500 cords), birch (513,200 cords), and balsam fir (243,100 cords).

Wisconsin imported 18 percent of the pulpwood it required, including 368,500 cords from Michigan, 68,900 cords from Minnesota, 116,200 cords from other (primarily Western) States, and 23,200 cords from Canada. Michigan imported 8 percent of its pulpwood needs, and Minnesota imported 3 percent.

Counties cutting more than 120,000 cords were Delta, Menominee, Dickinson, Iron, and Marquette in Michigan; Koochiching, St. Louis, Beltrami, Cass, and Itasca in Minnesota; and Forest, Lincoln, Marinette, Oneida, Vilas, Bayfield, and Sawyer in Wisconsin. These 17 counties contributed 44 percent of the pulpwood produced from roundwood in the Lake States in 1986.
